It is with great pleasure that I inform our readers that we concluded Financial Year 2024-2025 with stellar numbers and remarkable achievements. We witnessed a growth of over 200% in both revenue and the number of skilled individuals in the sector. We actively engaged with industry, academia, and government departments in a cohesive and collaborative manner. The efforts of the LSSSDC team are translated into successful outcomes, which I am pleased to share below.

We are delighted to announce the establishment of our first state-of-the-art Skill Development Centre at Vijayawada, under a CSR partnership with Suven Pharma and Swarna Bharat Trust. This centre stands as a testament to our continued efforts to create real-time impact through our initiatives and programs. Youths aspiring to join the Life Sciences sector will now have the opportunity to gain industry-relevant skills and secure employment within the sector.

Two additional Skill Development Centres are established in Hyderabad, supported by CSR grants from Biological E and Piramal Foundation, respectively. It is our earnest endeavour at LSSSDC to provide end-to-end solutions for skill development and career progression. We aim to set up at least 10 such centres this year, and discussions are currently underway.

Another key responsibility undertaken by LSSSDC is working alongside the Department of Pharmaceuticals (DoP) as the Project Management Agency (PMA) for the execution of their Scheme for Strengthening of the Medical Devices Sector. A substantial amount of work is currently in progress, involving close coordination with industry and academic partners. These efforts are expected to result in significant funding support for several initiatives, in line with the scheme's guidelines. We are confident that this will contribute significantly to the rapid growth of the medical devices sector in the near future.

This year also marked the first time LSSSDC organized a national-level conference, in collaboration with EduOrien and the PDA India Chapter. This event marked the beginning of a long-term

partnership to bring together thought leaders from all our stakeholder groups onto a common platform. The conference witnessed highly relevant and thought-provoking deliberations, resulting in valuable guidance documents that will help sharpen our deliverables. We look forward to organizing the second edition of this event in the next financial year.

In addition, we surpassed our previous year's performance under the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS), enrolling over 24,000 apprentices this year. Multiple workshops were conducted throughout the year, including an in-person session held in Dehradun. NAPS remains a key focus area for LSSSDC, and in the coming financial year, we plan to conduct more than 10-12 cluster-based workshops across the Pharma and Medical Devices sectors to promote awareness and participation in NAPS.

*Finally, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude for your continued encouragement and support. We look forward to staying connected with you in the coming financial year and will continue to share updates on our achievements and initiatives through quarterly editions of *Srijan*. In the meantime, I encourage you to contribute your thoughts and insights to future editions.*

Empowering India’s Youth Through Apprenticeship:

A Closer Look at the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS)

India’s youthful demographic has long been seen as a strategic advantage for national development. But to transform this potential into real economic growth, it is essential to equip young Indians with industry-relevant, hands-on skills. In response to this need, the Government of India launched the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) in August 2016, under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE).

NAPS is a forward-thinking initiative that connects academic learning with practical training, fosters strong industry partnerships, and incentivizes both employers and apprentices to participate in shaping a future-ready workforce.

Vision and Key Objectives

At the heart of NAPS is the goal to cultivate a robust apprenticeship ecosystem across India. The program operates with the following core objectives:

- **Skilling the Workforce:** By emphasizing practical training, NAPS helps create a pipeline of skilled professionals ready to contribute to India’s economy.
- **Encouraging Employers:** The government subsidizes 25% of the apprentice stipend (up to 1,500/ month), reducing the financial burden on employers.
- **Boosting Career Pathways:** Youth who have completed short-term training under other government programs can further build their competencies through apprenticeships.



- **Inclusive Growth:** The scheme actively reaches out to MSMEs, aspirational districts, and the North- East region to ensure equal opportunities across geographies.
- **Ecosystem Awareness:** Through job fairs, work- shops, and advocacy, NAPS raises awareness and expands apprenticeship adoption across sectors.

Key Features at a Glance

- **Dual Benefit Model:** NAPS offers a win- win proposition—apprentices receive practical, industry-relevant training and

stipends, while employers benefit from subsidized, skilled man- power tailored to their operational needs. Additionally, apprentices can be recruited for long-term roles within the organization, supporting future workforce sustainability.

- **Financial Incentives:**

- *Stipend Support:* A 25% stipend reimbursement (up to 1,500 monthly) is directly transferred to apprentices via a transparent Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system.
- *Training Cost Assistance:* For first-time apprentices, the Government covers basic training costs up to 7,500, easing onboarding for employers and access for youth.

- **Digital Enablement:** The Apprenticeship India Portal (www.apprenticeshipindia.gov.in) streamlines registration, contract management, monitoring, and compliance tracking—making the process seamless, transparent, and efficient.

- **Broad Eligibility and Access:**

- **Minimum Age:** 14 years (18 years for hazardous trades).
- *Maximum Age for Government Support:* 35 years.
- **Coverage:** All apprenticeship categories except graduate, technician, and vocational apprentices (which are managed under NATS by the Ministry of Education).

- **Alignment with National Missions:** NAPS closely complements flagship initiatives like *Skill India*, *Make-in-India*, *Aatmanirbhar Bharat*, and *Gati Shakti*, ensuring that apprenticeships contribute directly to the country's broader development goals.

- **Aligned with India's Development Vision**

NAPS complements several flagship national programs including:

- Skill India – by building a skilled and employable youth workforce
- Make in India – by supplying trained man- power to manufacturing industries
- Aatmanirbhar Bharat – by promoting self-reliance through job readiness
- PM Gati Shakti – by supporting logistical and infrastructure workforce needs

As India continues its journey toward becoming a global innovation and manufacturing hub, apprenticeship-based skilling will play a critical role in preparing the country's youth for emerging opportunities. NAPS represents a scalable, inclusive, and industry-aligned approach to workforce development.

The Life Sciences Sector Skill Development Council (LSSSDC) has taken a significant step forward in advancing the medical devices ecosystem in India. On 20th March 2025, LSSSDC signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Department of Pharmaceuticals, officially appointing LSSSDC as the Authorized Project Management Agency (PMA) for four sub-schemes under the Government of India's flagship "Strengthening of the Medical Device Industry (SMDI)" scheme.

The four sub-schemes under LSSSDC's purview as PMA include:

- Marginal Investment Scheme for Reducing Import Dependence
- Medical Device Clinical Studies Support Scheme
- Capacity Building and Skill Development for Medical Devices

- Medical Device Promotions Scheme

The application window for the first three sub-schemes was open until 31st January 2025, and the response was encouraging:

- Marginal Investment Scheme: 48 applications received
- Clinical Studies Support Scheme: 50 applications received
- Capacity Building and Skill Development (Component B): 111 applications received

All submitted applications are currently under detailed review. This development reflects LSSSDC's expanding role in supporting the growth and self-reliance of India's medical device industry through focused investment, innovation support, skill development, and sectoral promotion.

The Centre of Excellence is a unique initiative spearheaded by the Life Sciences Sector Skill Development Council (LSSSDC), with generous sponsorship from Suven Pharmaceuticals Limited under their CSR initiative, and in partnership with the Swarna


Adding an international dimension, Lisa Bennett offered valuable global perspectives on skilling trends. The agenda was further enriched by dynamic sessions led


