## From CEO's Desk





Dear Readers,

We, at LSSSDC, wishes all our stakeholders, partners and collaborators a **very happy, healthy and successful 2024.** May this year bring "Srijan" of many new good things for all of you as it is for us in "Creation" of skilling opportunities, relevant skilling products and skilled manpower for Life Sciences Sector.

Reflecting on the last quarter, Q3, 2023 has been incredibly productive for us and the entire team stepped up the pace of activities and deliverables. On one hand we received skilling target allocation of **5400 number** under PMKVY (Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojna) from Ministry, on the other we could initiate special projects with the industry and academia. Continuous skilling happened under Sankalp project for **7500 MSME employees** and through HPKVN projects (**360 Individuals**).

We participated in various events (organized by CII, OPPI, Pharmexcil, ABLE, Informa Markets and others) and were invited for panel discussions wherein we emphasized the need for continuous skilling, re-skilling, and up-skilling of existing workforce. We believe and highlighted that the key differentiator between 'successful company' and others is the availability of skilled manpower. LSSSDC is committed to the mission of providing skilled manpower to the sector and thus focused on

- Creation of additional - products (13 Programs), including 7 Qualification, 4 microcredentials for conducting short duration skilling and 2 NOS based Qualification, We created specific skilling products for the Clinical Research and MedTech subsectors. These are tremendously growing sub-sectors, which will need large numbers of skilled manpower in a short time. This will specifically help academic institutions and our training partners to have flexibility to work with microcredentials.



- Apprenticeship enrollment and assessment We empaneled 2Coms as our project management unit (PMU) for Apprenticeship last quarter and initiated a nationwide campaign to enhance the enrollments of apprentices. So far, we have enrolled about 15,800 apprentices, however the assessment of apprentices on completion of their contract is still lukewarm. This is a mandatory requirement to complete the assessment of apprentices as they will be getting the certificate and due credits. We have an ambitious target to achieve this year on apprenticeship and we seek your support for the same.
- GMP programs with revised Schedule M contents LSSSDC has an excellent 360-degree GMP program module and many reputed pharmaceutical companies have conducted skilling of their workforce through our product. We are upgrading the same with new contents and will be fully compliant to the revised schedule M launched by CDSCO recently. We will reach out to all the companies and associations for conducting skilling on GMP through this product. Our goal is to upgrade the existing workforce according to the updated Schedule-M standards and provide training for new personnel.
- Council as PMU LSSSDC will soon be working as PMU for DoP (Department of Pharmaceuticals) for implementation of HRD scheme for Medical Devices. This is an important step for the Council to embark on skilling 3000+ individuals in the MedTech sector. The council has already received approvals for 6 qualifications in Medical Devices ranging from testing, manufacturing, supply chain management and sales & marketing.

We are also engaging with corporates for allocating next year's **CSR funding to LSSSDC** for skilling initiatives. This will help us develop upgraded and new age skilling interventions which will in turn help the Life Sciences sector to have skilled manpower.



- 4. Clinical Data Reporting and Analysis

In addition to the micro credentials, two new NOS – Based qualifications have been added to LSSSDC's repertoire:

- 1. Pharmacovigilance Case Processing
- 2. Aggregate Report writing for Regulatory Compliance

In addition, 7 New qualifications have been added to LSSSDC's repertoire catering to various subsectors job area specifically to


- Analyst- Drug Safety / Pharmacovigilance

## Navigating the Future: Impact of the Revised Schedule M on Pharma and Biopharma Industry

The pharmaceutical and biopharmaceutical industry is on the verge of transformative change with the recent launch of the revised Schedule M of the Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945. This overhaul introduces a set of rigorous Good Manufacturing Practice (GMP) guidelines, requiring professionals to upskill and adapt swiftly. This article explores how training initiatives are poised to play a pivotal role in navigating the challenges and opportunities presented by the revised Schedule M.

### **Key Changes and Training Implications:**

The revised Schedule M includes the introduction of critical elements such as the Pharmaceutical Quality System (PQS), Quality Risk Management (QRM), and Product Quality Review (PQR), with specific guidelines for the qualification and validation of equipment, demands a workforce equipped with advanced competencies. Industry is required to introduce GMP training programs focused on providing professionals with a profound understanding of systematic manufacturing processes, Risk Management, and proficiency in utilizing computerized systems for ensuring data integrity according to the requirements.

#### **Empowering the Workforce:**

One of the significant impacts of the revised Schedule M is the call for upskilling the existing workforce and preparing new entrants for the ever-evolving standards. Industry Training initiatives need to empower professionals with the skills necessary to meet the stringent regulatory requirements outlined in the revised Schedule M. This includes fostering expertise in the use of technology for GMP-related processes and adherence to the latest industry standards.

#### Technological Integration and Skill Training:

The emphasis on computerized systems within the revised Schedule M necessitates a shift towards integrating technology into training methodologies. Simulations, Past experiences, and real-world case studies will be incorporated into training programs to ensure that professionals are not only theoretically aware of the technological advancements but also proficient in applying them in practical scenarios.

#### **LSSSDC Offerings:**

Given the critical nature of pharmaceutical and bio-pharmaceutical manufacturing, certification and accreditation become paramount. LSSSDC is having skill programs aligned to revised Schedule M for ready Implementation.
